### Noble County Health Department Public Records Policy

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### Introduction

This Public Records Policy is adopted by the Noble County Board of Health in accordance with the applicable provisions of House Bill 9 (126<sup>th</sup> General Assembly), primary authority being Ohio Revised Code Chapter 149. **This policy is not intended to be legal advice.** It is the policy of this public office to strictly adhere to the states Public Records Act as well as other state and federal laws.

The Public Records Act imposes two primary obligations upon public offices:

- Provide prompt inspection of public records; and
- Provide copies of public records within a reasonable period of time.

These obligations, in turn, provide the public with two primary rights:

- The right to prompt inspection of public records; and
- The right to copies within a reasonable period of time.

The Public Records Act evolved from the principle that Ohio¢s citizens are entitled to access the records of their government. To advance that principle, the Public Records Act is to be interpreted liberally¹ in favor of disclosure². Additionally, the exemptions to the Public Records Act, which are discussed more fully later, should be narrowly construed.³ In summary, whenever possible, the Public Records Act and its exemptions should be construed liberally in favor of giving the public utmost access to their records.

#### SECTION 1 PUBLIC RECORDS

Under Ohio law, a public office may only create records that are ‰ecessary for the adequate and proper documentation of the organization, functions, policies, decisions, procedures and essential transactions of the agency and for the protection of the legal and financial rights of the state and persons directly affected by the agency activities. ⁴

#### Section 1.1 Public Record Definition

In accordance with the Ohio Revised Code and court filings, a record is defined as any item kept<sup>5</sup> by a public office that meets all of the following:

- Is stored on a fixed medium (such as paper, electronic . including but not limited to e-mail, and other formats);
- Is created or received by, or sent under the jurisdiction of a public office;
- Documents the organization, functions, policies, decisions, procedures, operations, or other activities of the office.<sup>6</sup>

If any of these three elements is absent, the item is not a %ecord+and therefore is not a public record.

Furthermore, a public office is <u>not</u> required to create new records to respond to a public records request, even if it is only a matter of compiling information from existing records.<sup>7</sup>

### Section 1.2 Exemption to Public Records Law

Generally, the confidential nature of certain types of information or records precludes their release. Federal and state law provides numerous exceptions to the general rule that disclosure of public records is mandatory. However, most of the exceptions do not, by themselves, prohibit the release of the prescribed records. Rather, these records merely are excluded from the general rule of mandatory disclosure.<sup>8</sup>

In the event a request is made to inspect or obtain a copy of a record maintained by the public office whose release may be prohibited or exempted by wither state or federal law, the request shall be forwarded to the County Prosecutor for

research and/or review. The requestor shall be advised that their request is being reviewed by the County Prosecutor to ensure that protected exempted information is not improperly released.

Records whose release is found to be prohibited or exempted by either state or federal law, or not considered public records as defined by ORC § 149.43 (A)(1) shall NOT be subject to public inspection.

Please see *Appendix A* for a list of records that may not be subject to release per ORC § 149.43 (A)(1), *Appendix B* for a list of the most common express exemptions in Ohio law, and finally, *Appendix C* for a non-exhaustive list of express exemptions found throughout the Ohio Revised Code.

### SECTION 2 PUBLIC RECORDS REQUESTS

All public records maintained by the health department shall be promptly prepared and made available for inspection to any person during regular business hours as well as a copy available of the current record retention schedule of this department. Each request for public records should be evaluated for a response using the following guideline:

### Section 2.1 Identification of Public Record

Although no specific language is required to make a request, the requester must at least identify, retrieve, and review the records. If a requester makes an ambiguous or overly broad request for public records such that this department cannot reasonably identify the exact public records being requested, then this department may deny the request. In such case, this department will provide the requester with an opportunity to revise the request by informing the requester of the manner in which records are maintained by this department and accessed in the ordinary course of this departments duties.<sup>9</sup>

### Section 2.2 Format of Request

The Health Department or the person responsible for public records may ask a requester to make the request in writing, may ask for the requesters identity, and may inquire about the intended use of the information requested, but <u>only</u> after <u>all</u> of the following occur:

- Disclosure to the requester that a written request is not mandatory;
- Disclosure to the requester that the requester may decline to reveal the requester identity or intended use;
- Determine by the Health Department that a written requester or disclosure of the identity or intended use would benefit the requester by enhancing the ability to identify, locate, or deliver the public records sought by the requester.<sup>10</sup>

### Section 2.3 Choices of Medium

The public records law allows a person to choose the medium upon which they would like a record to be duplicated.<sup>11</sup> The requester can choose to have the record (1) on paper, (2) in the same form as this health department keeps it (e.g. on computer disk), or (3) on any medium upon which the health department

determines the record can **%e**asonably be duplicated as an integral part of the normal operations of the health department. 12

### **Section 2.4 Response Time to Request**

Public records must be available for inspection during regular business hours and made available for inspection promptly. Copies of public records must be made available within a reasonable period of time. However, under current Ohio law, there is no defined period of time to which a public records request must be completed. Instead, appropriate (prompt and reasonable) response times will vary depending on different factors, including, but not limited to all of the following:

- The circumstances of the health department at the time of the request;
- The breadth of the request; 13
- Whether legal evaluation of the responsive records is required before release.<sup>14</sup>

### Section 2.5 Prohibition against Requesters Right to Make Copies Themselves

A requester seeking copies of public records is not permitted to make their own copies of the requested records by any means.<sup>15</sup> This measure is to protect the integrity of the original document.

### Section 2.6 Limit to number of Requests by Mail

The health department may limit the number of records requested by a person that the health department will transmit by United States mail to ten per month, unless the person certifies to the office in writing that the person does not intend to use or forward the requested records, or the information contained in them, for commercial purposes. (The scope of the word ‰mmercial+is to be narrowly construed and does not include reporting or gathering news, reporting or gathering information to assist citizen oversight or understanding of the operation or activities of government, or nonprofit education research).<sup>16</sup>

### **Section 2.7 Requests by Incarcerated Persons**

Under Ohio law, an incarcerated person may receive public records, but only if the records concern a criminal investigation. The incarcerated person must also follow very strict guidelines.

- The record must be public records+which are not subject to an exemption from disclosure;
- The incarcerated person must have secured a finding from the judge who imposed the sentence of incarceration (or that judge successor) that the information sought in the public record is necessary to support a justifiable claim of the person.<sup>17</sup>

Courts have denied the public records requests of inmates because this procedure was not followed.<sup>18</sup>

### SECTION 3 DENIAL OF PUBLIC RECORDS REQUESTS

If a request is ultimately denied, in part or in whole, the health department shall provide the requester with an explanation, including legal authority, setting forth why the request was denied. Further, if the initial request was provided in writing, the explanation shall be provided to the requester in writing.<sup>19</sup>

### Section 3.1 Denial of an Ambiguous or Overly Broad Request for Public Record

In a requester makes an ambiguous or overly broad request or has difficulty in making a request for copies or inspection of public records such that the health department cannot reasonably identify what public records are being requested:

- The health department may deny the request;
- However, the health department shall provide the requester with an opportunity to revise the request by informing the requester of the manner in which records are maintained in the ordinary course of business.<sup>20</sup>

### Section 3.2 Denial of a Public Record not Maintained by the Noble County Health Department

If the health department receives a request for a record that it does not maintain or the request is for a record which is no longer maintained, the requester shall be so notified in writing utilizing Form PR-1 that one of the following applies:

- The request involves records that have never been maintained by the health department
- The request involves records that are no longer maintained or have been disposed of or transferred pursuant to applicable Schedules of Record Retention and Disposition (RC-2);
- The request involves a record that has been disposed of pursuant to an Application of the One-Time Records Disposal (RC-1);
- If the record that is requested is not a record used or maintained by the health department, the requester shall be notified that the health department is under no obligation to create records to meet public records requests (however, if applicable, the health department will inform the requester of how the information requested is organized).

### Section 3.3 Denial of a Public Record Maintained by the Noble County Health Department

The health department may deny a request for a record maintained by the health department in the record that is requested is prohibited from release due to applicable state or federal law.

- If the record request is denied in its entirety:
  - The health department may check the appropriate box on Form PR-1 if the employee is simply applying the statutory exclusion.
  - The health department shall consult the County Prosecutor if the employee is unsure if the record requested is exempt from disclosure
- If only part of the record is not subject to release, the health department will redact such information and release the non-exempted information:

  - The health department will check the appropriate box on Form PR-1 and cite the exemption from Appendix A, B, or C with the corresponding redaction.
  - The health department shall consult the County Prosecutor if the employee is unsure if a part of the record requested is exempt from disclosure.

As a custodian of public records, the health department has a responsibility to maintain the integrity of the record. As such, any request that included redactions should be made on a copy of the original record to preserve the authenticity and accuracy of the original document.

The explanation cited shall not preclude the health department from relying upon additional reasons or legal authority in defending an action commenced pursuant to ORC § 149.03.

#### **SECTION 4 COSTS FOR PUBLIC RECORDS**

Generally, a requester is only required to pay the health department for the actual cost of reproduction. Employee time <u>will not</u> be calculated into the <u>actual cost+charge</u>. However, in some circumstances, it is permissible for the health department to have an outside contractor make copies and recover the cost of the service directly from the requester. The health department may employ the services of a private contractor to produce copies as long as the decision to do so is reasonable. <sup>23</sup>

### Section 4.1 Payment in Advance

The health department may require a requester to pay in advance the cost involved in providing the copy of the public record, as requested. For photocopies of either letter or legal sized documents, the fee shall be ten cents (\$0.10) per photocopy. If video tapes, cassette tapes or any other type of media is requested, the fee shall be the replacement cost or reproduction cost (copying costs of outside vendor is necessary).

### Section 4.2 Delivery Costs to be Paid in Advance

Requesters may ask that documents be mailed or transmitted to them within a reasonable period of time after the health department receives the request for a copy. The health department may require the person making the request to pay in advance the cost of postage if the copy is transmitted by U.S. mail or the cost of delivery if the copy is transmitted other than by U.S. mail,, or to pay in advance the costs incurred for other supplies (envelope, etc.) used in the mailing, delivery, or transmission.<sup>24</sup>

#### SECTION 5 EMAIL

Documents in electronic mail format are records as defined by the Ohio Revised Code when their content relates to the business of the health department. Email must be treated in the same fashion as records in other formats and should follow the same retention schedules.

### Section 5.1 Public Email Accounts

- Records in public email accounts used to conduct public business are subject to disclosure, and all officials, employees, or other representatives of the health department are instructed to retain such e-mails that relate to public business in accordance with the health departments record retention schedule.
- Records in public email accounts used while on health department computers not used to conduct public business, while strongly prohibited by the health departments policies and procedures are not subject to disclosure.<sup>25</sup>

### Section 5.2 Private Email Accounts

- Records in private email accounts used to conduct public business on public property (i.e. health department computers) may be subject to disclosure, and all officials, employees, or other representatives of the health department are instructed to retain such private emails should they relate to public business.<sup>26</sup>
- Such emails from private accounts should be treated as records of the health department, retaining them per established schedules, and making them available for inspection and copying in accordance with the Public Record Act.

### SECTION 6 FAILURE TO RESPOND TO A PUBLIC RECORDS REQUEST

The Noble County Health Department recognizes that the failure to properly respond to a public records request not only causes distrust in government, but may also lead to legal consequences.

If a requester feels that they have been improperly denied public records due to the inability to inspect or to receive a copy of a record, the requester shall be advised that they may

- Contact the Health Commissioner or the Board of Health
- Request a meeting with the County Prosecutor

If the requester is still not satisfied, he/she shall be advised that the Ohio Revised Code provides a legal means for addressing the complaint.

### APPENDIX A THE EXPRESS EXEMPTION

In accordance with the Ohio Revised Code § 149.43, % Rublic Record+does not mean any of the following:

### (a) Medical records:

Medical record+means any document or combination of documents, except births, deaths, and the fact of admission to or discharge from a hospital, that pertains to the medical history, diagnosis, prognosis, or medical condition of a patient and that is generated and maintained in the process of medical treatment.

- (b) Records pertaining to probation and parole proceedings or to proceedings related to the imposition of community control sanctions and post-release control sanctions;
- (c) Records pertaining to the actions under section 2151.85 and division © of section 2919.121 of the Ohio Revised Code and to appeals of actions arising under those sections;
- (d) Records pertaining to adoption proceedings, including the contents of an adoption file maintained by the department of health under section 3705.12 of the Ohio Revised Code:
- (e) Information in a record contained in the putative father registry established by section 3107.062 of the Ohio Revised Code, regardless of whether the information is held by the department of job and family services or, pursuant to section 3111.69 of the Ohio Revised Code, the office of child support in the department or a child support enforcement agency;
- (f) Records listed in division (A) of section 3107.42 of the Ohio Revised Code or specified in division (A) of section 3107.52 of the Ohio Revised Code:

### (g) Trial preparation records;

Wirial preparation record+means any record that contains information that is specifically compiled in reasonable anticipation of, or in defense of, a civil or criminal action or proceeding, including the independent thought processes and personal trial preparation of an attorney.

### (h) Confidential law enforcement investigatory records;

Confidential law enforcement investigatory record+means any record that pertains to a law enforcement matter of a criminal, quasi-criminal, civil, or administrative nature, but only to the extent that the release of the record would create a high probability of disclosure of any of the following: 1) The identity of a

suspect who has not been charged with the offense to which the record pertains, or of an information source or witness to whom confidentiality has been reasonably promised; 2) Information provided by an information source or witness to whom confidentiality has been reasonably promised, which information would reasonably tend to disclose the sources or witnesss identity; 3) Specific confidential investigatory techniques or procedures or specific investigatory work product; or 4) Information that would endanger the life or physical safety of law enforcement personnel, a crime victim, a witness, or a confidential information source.

- (i) Records containing information that is confidential under section 2710.03 or section 4112.05 of the Ohio Revised Code;
- (j) DNA records stored in the DNA database pursuant to section 109.573 of the Ohio Revised Code:
- (k) Inmate records released by the department of rehabilitation and correction to the department of youth services or a court of record pursuant to division 5120.21 of the Ohio Revised Code;
- (I) Records maintained by the department of youth services pertaining to children in custody released by the department of youth services to the department of rehabilitation and correction pursuant to section 5139.05 of the Ohio Revised Code;

### (m) Intellectual property records;

% tellectual property record+means a record, other than a financial or administrative record, that is produced or collected by or for a faculty of staff of a state institution of higher learning in the conduct of or as a result of study or research on an educational, commercial, scientific, artistic, technical, or scholarly issue, regardless of whether the study or research was sponsored by the institution alone or in conjunction with a governmental body or private concern, and that has not been publicly released, published, or patented.

### (n) Donor profile records;

© Conor profile record+means all records about donors or potential donors to a public institution of higher education except the names and reported addresses of the actual donors and the date, amount, and conditions of the actual donation.

(o) Records maintained by the Department of Job and Family Services pursuant to section 3121.894 of the Ohio Revised Code;

(p) Peace officer, parole officer, prosecuting attorney, assistant prosecuting attorney, correctional employee, youth services employee, firefighter, or EMT residential and familial information;

Reace officer, parole officer, prosecuting attorney, assistant prosecuting attorney, correctional employee, youth services employee, firefighter, or EMT residential and familial information+(hereto after referred to the as the protected class employee) means any information that discloses any of the following about such a protected class employee:

- The address of the actual personal residence of a protected class employee, except for the state or political subdivision in which the protected class employee resides;
- (2) Information compiled from referral to or participation in an employee assistance program;
- (3) The social security number, the residential telephone number, any bank account, debit card, charge card, or credit card number, or the emergency telephone number of, or any medical information pertaining to a protected class employee;
- (4) The name of any beneficiary of employee benefits, including, but not limited to, life insurance benefits, provided to a protected class employees employer;
- (5) The identity and amount on any charitable or employment benefit deduction made by the protected class employees compensation unless the amount of the deduction is required by state or federal law;
- (6) The name, the residential address, the name of the employer, the address of the employer, the social security number, the residential telephone number, any bank account, debit card, charge card, or credit card number, or the emergency telephone number of the spouse, a former spouse, or any child of a protected class employee;
- (7) A photograph of a peace officer who holds a position or has an assignment that may include undercover or plain clothes positions or assignments as determined by the peace officers appointing authority.

Further, there is a journalist mechanism by which a journalist can request such information. The request shall include the journalists name and title and the name and address of the journalists employer and shall state that disclosure of the information sought would be in the public interest.

(q) In the case of a county hospital operated pursuant to Chapter 339 of the Ohio Revised Code or a municipal hospital operated pursuant to Chapter 749 of the Revised Code, information that constitutes a trade secret, as defined in section 1333.61 of the Ohio Revised Code;

(r) Information pertaining to the recreational activities of a person under the age of eighteen;

% formation pertaining to the recreational activities of a person under the age of eighteen+means information that is kept in the ordinary course of business by a public office, that pertains to the recreational activities of a person under the age of eighteen years, and that discloses any of the following:

- (1) The address or telephone number of a person under the age of eighteen or the address or telephone number of that persons parent, guardian, custodian, or emergency contact person;
- (2) The social security number, birth date, or photographic image of a person under the age of eighteen;
- (3) Any medical record, history, or information pertaining to a person under the age of eighteen;
- (4) Any additional information sought or required about a person under the age of eighteen for the purpose of allowing that person to participate in any recreational activity conducted or sponsored by a public office or to use or obtain admission privileges to any recreational facility owned or operated by a public office.
- (s) Records provided to and statements made by review board members during meetings of, and all work products of a child fatality review board acting under sections 307.621 to 307.629 of the Ohio Revised Code, other that the report prepared pursuant to section 307.626 of the Ohio Revised Code;
- (t) Records provided to and statements made by the executive director of a public children services agency or a prosecuting attorney acting pursuant to section 5153.171 of the Ohio Revised Code other than the information released under that section;
- (u) Test materials, examinations, or evaluation tools used in an examination for licensure as a nursing home administrator that the board of examiners for nursing home administrators administers under section 4751.04 of the Ohio Revised Code or contracts under that section with a private or government entity to administer;
- (v) Records the release of which is prohibited by state or federal law;
- (w) Proprietary information of or related to any person that is submitted to or compiled by the Ohio venture capital authority created under section 150.01 of the Ohio Revised Code:
- (x) Information reported and evaluations conducted pursuant to section 3701.072 of the Ohio Revised Code;

(y) Financial statements and data any person submits for any purposes to the Ohio housing finance agency or the controlling board in connection with applying for, receiving, or accounting for financial assistance from the agency, and information that identifies any individual who benefits directly or indirectly from financial assistance from the agency.

### APPENDIX B THE "CATCH-ALL" EXEMPTION

If any provision of Ohio or federal law prohibits public disclosure of a certain type of record, a public office must not release it in response to a public records request. A state statute or rule, or a federal statute or regulation may designate the records of certain government offices or particular types of records confidential. Such a designation means those records are not subject to the provisions of the Public Records Act.

Some common %atch-all+exemptions include:

- (a) Attorney-client privileged information<sup>27</sup>
- (b) Medical board investigative records<sup>28</sup>
- (c) Child abuse reports<sup>29</sup>
- (d) Student education records (maintained by public schools, colleges, universities and at private institutions receiving public funding.<sup>30</sup> However,
